Day 1 | Depart gateway city

AHI FlexAir passengers depart for Budapest, Hungary. Please check your luggage from your gateway city to your arrival city. Your claim checks should have the following airport code: BUD.

Day 2 | Budapest, Hungary

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Arrive at Budapest Ferenc Liszt International Airport. Proceed through immigration to the baggage claim area and retrieve your luggage. After completing customs, AHI FlexAir passengers traveling on flights that qualify for the group arrival transfer and Cruise Program passengers who have purchased seats on the group transfer should exit the baggage claim area and proceed to the Arrivals Hall, where an AHI Travel representative will meet you.

Transfer to the pier and embark your first-class ship. Please note that if you arrive before check-in time, your cabin may not be immediately available.

Welcome Reception & Dinner. Meet and mingle with your fellow travelers at the Welcome Reception and Dinner aboard the ship this evening.

Day 3 | Budapest

Enjoy a hearty breakfast aboard the ship each morning during your cruise.

The breathtaking capital of Hungary was once two cities, Buda and Pest, on opposite sides of the Danube until 1872, when Buda and Pest merged to form Budapest, with the river flowing through the city's center.

Personalize Your Journey | Choose one of the following excursions.

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Budapest Panoramic Tour. Set out on a motor coach tour through the city's Buda and Pest sections, including some short stops along the way. Drive along the iconic, UNESCO-inscribed Andrassy Avenue, pass by the symbolic Heroes' Square, the Neo-Renaissance Hungarian State Opera House and the magnificent Neo-Gothic-style Parliament Building. In the UNESCO World Heritage-listed Buda Castle Quarter, see the 700-year-old Matthias Church, known for its colorful Zsolnay tiles, and take in the panoramic views from the Fisherman's Bastion. (Moderate)

- **Local Culture Experience.** On a guided walking and coach tour, visit Budapest's bustling 19th-century Great Market Hall, the city's largest and oldest indoor market. Experience Hungarian gastronomy, culture and local life as you meander through the three levels of the historic structure. Peruse vendors selling Hungarian foodstuffs and handmade folk crafts. Continue on a panoramic tour of Budapest, stopping at a coffee house. Learn how pastry chefs make flaky, delicious strudel, followed by a delicious tasting with coffee or tea and Hungary's palinka schnapps. (Moderate)
- **Budapest's Jewish Quarter.** Explore Budapest's Jewish Quarter on a coach and walking tour. Visit Europe's largest synagogue, the 19th-century Moorish Revival-style Dohány Street Synagogue, and see the Weeping Willow Tree sculpture memorial park. Also, visit the Holocaust Memorial Center, which preserves the tragic history of the 600,000 Hungarian Jews who perished during the Holocaust. Plus, see the moving Shoes on the Danube Bank memorial. (Moderate)

Budapest by Night. After dinner this evening, set out on a farewell cruise through Budapest and marvel at the city's amazing sights at night. See the Parliament Building and the Buda Castle, which are even more spectacular when illuminated, and cruise under the magnificent Chain Bridge. What a special way to begin your voyage! (Mild)

Day 4 | Bratislava, Slovakia

As you arrive in medieval Bratislava, notice the futuristic Most SNP bridge, the Bridge of the Slovak National Uprising, crossing the Danube River, a unique feat in engineering.

Enrichment: The Velvet Revolution and the Making of Slovakia. Learn about the Velvet Revolution, a pivotal event that led to the end of communism in Czechoslovakia and preceded the country's split into the Czech Republic and Slovakia. Gain insight into the development of Slovakia as an independent nation.

Personalize Your Journey | Choose one of the following excursions.

- **Bratislava's Old Town & Café.** Explore picturesque Bratislava on a guided stroll to see highlights of the medieval old town. Marvel at St. Martin's Cathedral, once the site of Hungarian coronations. See the historical neo-renaissance Slovak National Theatre and the 14th-century St. Michael's Gate, Bratislava's only remaining medieval fortification gate. Pass by the Primate's Palace, where Hungarian archbishops spend their winters. Stop at a delightful café painted with scenes from the city's royal past and savor a traditional local pastry with coffee. (Moderate)
- **Bratislava's Old Town & Music.** Once the stage for composers like Mozart, Beethoven, Haydn and Liszt, Bratislava has a storied musical history. On a guided walk through the old town, learn about and see some venues where these composers gave their first concerts, taught piano or conducted premiers, such as the Philharmonic Orchestra building and the famous Ventúrska Street, where Mozart is believed to have performed a concert in 1762. Stop near the Zichy Palace to enjoy a performance by a talented young violinist. You'll also see other old town highlights, including St. Michael's Gate. (Moderate)
- **Hidden Vines of Bratislava.** Venture outside the city for a scenic drive past beautiful landscapes brimming with whimsical Slovak villages, rolling vineyards and emerald pastures. Visit a local winery for a guided tour and tasting of local Slovakian wines. (Mild)

Return to the ship for lunch and time to relax and enjoy the ship's amenities at leisure this afternoon.

The ship leaves Bratislava this evening, cruising for Vienna, Austria.

Day 5 | Vienna, Austria

Discover the enchanting, timeless European capital of Vienna today! From its ornate palaces and art galleries to its delicious coffee culture and respected concert halls, Vienna's treasures are vast and rich.

Enrichment: Timeless Vienna. Join a discussion about Vienna, one of the world's most elegant cities.

Personalize Your Journey | Choose one of the following excursions.

- Imperial Vienna. Explore the Imperial Apartments of Hofburg Palace to be awed by their sumptuous appointments, then drive along the Ringstrasse, one of the most magnificent boulevards in the world. See the University, the oldest in the German-speaking countries, the Houses of Parliament, the Opera House and monuments to Johann Strauss and Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. (Moderate)
- Vienna Woods. Journey just outside Vienna to explore the breathtaking natural landscape of the UNESCO-listed Wienerwald Biosphere Reserve. Take a guided walk among the rolling hills, lush forests and meandering trails surrounding Vienna, pausing at a viewpoint to appreciate the verdant, serene beauty. Stop at a local café for refreshments. (Active)
- Schönbrunn Palace and Gardens. Visit the beautiful Schönbrunn Palace and Gardens, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Visit the magnificent UNESCO-inscribed opulent royal residence, once the summer home of the Habsburgs between the 18th and 20th centuries. Marvel at the residence's baroque architecture, manicured gardens, lavish State Apartments and Hall of Mirrors. (Moderate)

Free Time: Return to the ship for lunch and the remainder of the afternoon at leisure. Shuttle buses will be available this afternoon and evening to transport you between the ship and the Schwedenplatz, Vienna's central square, for independent exploration.

The Viennese Waltz. Tonight, gather for a special performance of the Viennese waltz by professional dancers accompanied by a musical trio. Then take to the floor yourself to learn the steps of this classic, graceful dance! (Mild-Moderate)

Day 6 | Dürnstein | Melk

The ship cruises the beginning of the scenic Wachau Valley just before arriving in the beloved village of Dürnstein, located in one of Austria's notable wine-growing regions. It is home to the castle where King Richard the Lionheart was imprisoned and was once the seat of the medieval Kuenring dynasty.

Personalize Your Journey | Choose one of the following excursions.

- Dürnstein Walking Tour. Take a guided stroll through Dürnstein, admiring the baroque architecture, gorgeous scenery and vineyards that produce award-winning wine. You'll also visit the magnificent Stifts Dürnstein, the abbey church known for its pretty blue and white tower. (Moderate)
- Danube Cycling Adventure. Hop on a bike to cycle around Dürnstein and the beautiful Wachau Valley. During this two-hour guided adventure, explore parts of the 745-mile Danube Bicycle Trail, which runs from Germany to Hungary. Pass by lush vineyards and quaint villages set against the Danube, and enjoy a snack stop along the way. (Active)
- Wachau Winery Visit & Tasting. Head into town to visit a winery located in a beautiful old building. Learn about the locally produced wines and savor tastings of samples from its cellar. This renowned region is recognized for producing distinctive wines, including delicious Riesling and Grüner Veltliner. (Mild)

Enjoy daytime sailing through the picturesque Wachau Valley, which was designated a UNESCO World Heritage site for the structured development of architecture, city planning and agriculture since prehistoric times. Admire a bevy of historic villages, monasteries and castles nestled on the banks.

Melk Abbey. Arrive in Melk and disembark the ship to visit the famed Benedictine abbey, a UNESCO World Heritage site and baroque architectural jewel dating from 1736. Admire the stunningly beautiful interiors and spectacular views of the mighty Danube from the abbey's terrace. After the tour, you can walk downhill through the small town center or take a motor coach to return to the ship. (Moderate)

Day 7 | Passau, Germany

Arrive in Passau, nestled in a stunning location at the confluence of the Danube, Ilz and Inn rivers. After an early lunch, disembark the ship in Passau.

Picturesque Passau Walking Tour. Take a guided walk through Passau's charming Altstadt, the old town, where remnants of the medieval city's fortifications can still be seen. Stroll along the Residenzplatz, one of Passau's most beautiful squares, lined with elegant, well-preserved baroque and rococo buildings. In the lively central square, see the historic Rathaus Town Hall, with its Renaissance façade and beautiful clock tower. You'll also be able to view the medieval Veste Oberhaus fortress perched on a hill across the river on the left bank of the Danube. Pass by the 18th-century Neue Residenz, New Bishop's Residence, a beautiful palace designed in the Viennese Baroque style that was once home to Prince-Bishops of Passau, and the Alte Residenz, the Old Bishop's Palace, dating to the 14th century. It is located at the highest point of the Domplatz, Cathedral Square, and it was the center of ecclesiastical power in Passau for centuries. Timeless Passau will enchant you as you stroll along narrow cobblestone streets past colorful buildings and quaint shops. See the Niedernburg Monastery, a historic former Benedictine nunnery. Gisela (985-1065), Queen of Hungary and widow of King Stephen 1 of Hungary, spent her later years here as abbess, playing a significant role in Hungary's Christianization. Her tomb is located inside the adjoining Holy Cross Church.

You'll also visit St. Stephen's Cathedral, famous for its baroque architecture and the world's largest cathedral organ, with 17,974 pipes and 233 registers, creating a majestic sound. This has been the cathedral's site since the 8th century, with the current structure completed in 1688. The breathtaking baroque interior features elegant white and gold stucco adornments and ornate ceiling frescoes depicting biblical scenes in stunning detail. (Moderate)

The ship departs Passau in the late afternoon, cruising for Regensburg.

Day 8 | Regensburg

Wake up on the mighty Danube River this morning! Our next port of call is Regensburg, once a booming merchant city. Today, Regensburg brims with impressive Roman ruins, Gothic, Romanesque and baroque churches and colorful houses from the 12th and 13th centuries.

Enrichment: The Main-Danube Canal. Gather with a local expert to discuss the history, construction and importance of the legendary Main-Danube Canal, a man-made wonder.

Regensburg & Thurn und Taxis Palace. After an early lunch aboard the ship, set out to explore Regensburg, one of Germany's most charming towns. On a guided walking tour, see the ancient Roman tower and gateway of Porta Praetoria, the 12th-century Stone Bridge, the bright yellow Altes Rathaus, the Old Town Hall dating to the 1200s, and the enthralling St. Peter's Cathedral with its stunning stained-glass windows. Then, enjoy a guided visit to the Thurn und Taxis Palace, formerly a Benedictine monastery. This ancestral home has a spectacular ballroom and a throne room. (Moderate)

The ship cruises for Nuremberg early this afternoon. Later today, the ship enters the Main-Danube Canal, Europe's greatest manmade passageway, connecting the Main River to the Danube River. Completed in 1992, it was Emperor Charlemagne's vision more than 1,000 years ago, in 793.

Day 9 | Nuremberg

The cityscape of Nuremberg greets you this morning! Home to Europe's first printing press, Nuremberg is often associated with expansions in science and technology. Ancient city walls from the 14th and 15th centuries lead to an array of medieval gates and towers, while the imposing twin-towered Gothic St. Lorenz church watches over the town.

Personalize Your Journey | Choose one of the following excursions.

- Nuremberg Sightseeing.** Take a panoramic drive through the city and see the courthouse where the World War II trials were held. Then, take a guided walk, passing the city's renowned hilltop castle and courtyard. At the Hauptmarkt, an open square dominated

by the Schoener Brunnen, see the 14th-century Gothic fountain, the city's most famous attraction. View Our Lady's Church and St. Lorenz Church, dating to the 15th century. Return to the ship for lunch and the afternoon at leisure. (Moderate)

- History of the Nazi Party Rallies. During the years leading up to World War II and throughout the war, Nuremberg was strongly connected to the Nazi party. Visit a specially conceived Interim Exhibition in the Large Exhibition Hall at the Documentation Center, which presents the history of the Nazi Party Rallies and the Rally Grounds. Return to the ship for lunch and the afternoon at leisure. (Moderate)
- Franconian Countryside Tour & Distillery Tasting. Drive north from Nuremberg for Gössweinstein, passing idyllic countryside villages along the way. Visit the Franconian Switzerland Museum to learn about traditional Franconian Switzerland life; and the Gössweinstein Abbey, founded in 1127, an important religious and pilgrimage site with breathtaking views. Continue to a local distillery that makes schnapps from fruits grown in its orchards and savor tastings before lunching together at a traditional inn. (Moderate) Note: if this excursion is chosen, you will miss lunch on board and most free time in Nuremberg.

Free Time: If you wish to explore further on your own, a shuttle between the ship and Nuremberg will be available this afternoon.

The ship cruises for Regensburg this evening.

Day 10 | Bamberg

After a morning of cruising, arrive in endearing Bamberg, a UNESCO World Heritage-inscribed city that is spread across seven hills. Its winding cobbled lanes, well-preserved medieval architecture, baroque churches and charming atmosphere make Bamberg a cultural gem in the Franconia region of Bavaria.

Personalize Your Journey | Choose one of the following excursions.

- Bamberg Walking Tour. Embark on a guided walking tour of Bamberg, a UNESCO World Heritage site, to wander under the grand rococo archway of the Obere Brücke and delight in views of the red-roofed fishermen's houses and baroque mansions of this fairy-tale town. (Moderate)
- Culinary Delights. Enjoy a culinary tour of Bamberg, where Franconian and Bavarian influences are evident. Visit a local bakery, a butcher shop, a deli and a candy store. Along the way, learn about and sample specialties such as the flaky Bamberger Hörnla, the savory Bamberger Weck and the region's famous licorice. (Moderate)

Return to the ship, begin cruising toward Würzburg and marvel at the breathtaking views of the rolling hills, thick forests and picture-perfect villages perched on the banks of the Main River.

Day 11 | Würzburg

In this romantic region of Bavaria sits the old Franconian city of Würzburg, a village that will steal your heart with its history-steeped architecture, vibrant Old Town and trove of magnificent churches, including the Gothic St. Mary's Chapel and the Neumünster Collegiate Church. The Old Main Bridge, the Alte Mainbrücke, is a remarkable structure lined with statues of saints. After breakfast, disembark for your chosen excursion.

Personalize Your Journey | Choose one of the following excursions.

- The Romantic Road & Rothenburg. Once an important trade route during the Middle Ages, the Romantic Road follows a historic path through the foothills of the German Alps and Franconia wine country. As you wind through sleepy medieval villages and quaint Bavarian towns, you'll be captivated by the half-timbered homes, sweet alleyways decorated with colorful blooms and fairy-tale castles. Enjoy visiting Rothenburg, one of Germany's best-preserved, fortified medieval towns. Return to the ship for lunch. (Moderate – Active; there are a fair number of stairs to navigate at the residence.)
- Würzburg Residenz & City Walk. Begin with a visit to the renowned Würzburg Residenz, built between 1720 and 1744. The majestic UNESCO World Heritage site is one of Europe's finest secular baroque palaces. On a guided inside tour, gaze at the sumptuously

decorated Imperial Hall, the Hall of Mirrors and an impressive staircase featuring a brilliant fresco. Continue on a guided walk of this old Franconian city to see St. Kilian's Cathedral, the Neumünsterkirche, the Old Town Hall, the scenic market square and more. (Moderate)
Note: Lunch will be on your own if this excursion is chosen.

Free Time: Remain in town after the Würzburg Residence excursion, or head back to town after lunch to explore more of Würzburg at your leisure.

Later this afternoon, return to the ship, which departs early this evening for Miltenberg.

Day 12 | Miltenberg

Frühschoppen! Head to the deck for a one-of-a-kind event! Nibble, sip and socialize as you enjoy the German tradition of drinking beer accompanied by a tasty spread of Brezeln (pretzels), Weißwurst (sausages) and mustards. (Mild)

Miltenberg. A walking tour of romantic Miltenberg reveals traditional half-timbered houses and quaint taverns, plus a decorative, 16th-century octagonal fountain. See the Town Hall and Germany's oldest working inn with its storybook facade. Visit St. Kilian Kellerei, a wine shop that sits over a 15th-century vaulted ice cellar. Today, ice is no longer stored there, but it is a charming spot to enjoy a tasting of Franconian brandies. (Moderate)

Return to the ship and begin cruising toward Koblenz. Marvel at the breathtaking views of the rolling hills, thick forests and picture-perfect villages perched along the river banks.

Day 13 | Koblenz

Relax on deck this morning while cruising through one of the most gorgeous areas of Germany as the ship makes its way through the Upper Middle Rhine Valley, a particularly scenic stretch with castles and vineyards peppering the steep hills. At the narrowest point of the Rhine River, see the famous bronze Loreley Statue, representing the mythical siren Lorelei, a figure from German folklore who was said to sit atop the Lorelei Rock.

Arrive in Koblenz, located at the confluence of the Mosel and Rhine rivers. Disembark the ship to explore Koblenz, brimming with medieval history, monuments, an imposing fortress and a handful of quirky fountains.

Personalize Your Journey | Choose one of the following excursions.

- Koblenz Walking Tour. Take a guided morning walk through beautiful Koblenz, first established as a strategically placed settlement over 2,000 years ago by the Romans. See the Town Hall, the medieval Liebfrauenkirche, Church of Our Lady, the Alte Burg, Old Castle, the Altes Kaufhaus, Old Merchants' Hall, and the Deutsches Eck, German Corner, with the monument of Emperor Wilhelm II. (Moderate)
- Ehrenbreitstein Fortress. A cable car whisks you to this famous battlement perched on a rocky promontory high above the Rhine and Moselle rivers. Constructed in its present form between 1816 and 1832, Ehrenbreitstein is the second-largest preserved fortress in Europe, with origins dating to the 11th century. Enjoy a guided tour of the Koblenz State Museum's exhibits to learn about the fortress's storied history. Admire the beautiful panoramas from this vantage point over Koblenz and the rivers! (Moderate)

Free Time: Enjoy the remainder of the evening at your leisure in Koblenz.

The ship departs Koblenz late tonight, cruising overnight for Cologne.

Day 14 | Cologne

Wake up in Cologne, where the ship arrived very early this morning. Arrive in Cologne, disembark the ship and set out to explore this medieval city.

Cologne City Tour & Cologne Cathedral. Take a guided walk through Cologne's medieval quarter and then visit Kölner Dom, also known as the Cologne Cathedral, the famous 12th-century cathedral and UNESCO World Heritage site. Before you enter, note the façade, which features twin towers that rise to a height of 515 feet, as well as the pointed arches, ribbed vaults and soaring spires. Inside the Gothic-style cathedral, see the wooden Gero Crucifix, dating to the 10th century; the Shrine of the Three Kings, a stunning gilded sarcophagus behind the high altar; and the vibrant, intricate stained-glass windows, some dating to the medieval period. (Moderate)

Return to the ship and relax before this evening's Farewell Reception and Dinner.

Farewell Reception and Dinner. Raise a toast to your once-in-a-lifetime cruising adventure along storied rivers through Europe's heart at this evening's Farewell Reception and Dinner aboard the ship.

The ship departs Cologne late this afternoon. Enjoy the twilight scenery as the ship cruises for Amsterdam, Netherlands.

Day 15 | Amsterdam, Netherlands

Amsterdam is the capital of the Netherlands and the center of the country's culture and commerce. Named after the city's origin as a dam in the river Amstel, today Amsterdam is known worldwide for its more than 60 miles of tree-lined canals and waterways, making this romantic city truly unforgettable.

Personalize Your Journey | Choose one of the following excursions.

- **Rijksmuseum.** Join an audio tour of the Rijksmuseum, home to masterpieces by Rembrandt, Vermeer and other renowned artists. After the tour, enjoy free time to explore the museum on your own, linger in front of your favorite paintings or maybe stop for refreshments in the museum's café. (Moderate)
- **Waterland Bicycle Ride.** Thrill to a guided bike tour of scenic Waterland, an iconic wetland north of Amsterdam, composed of nine villages and boasting stunning views as well as hundreds of official monuments. Also pass through the towns of Zunderdorp, Ransdorp, and Durgerdam. Enjoy a stop for a pastry and coffee along the way. (Active)
- **Canal District Walking Tour.** Take a closer look at Amsterdam's canals during a walking tour of the Herengracht. The city's canals have a history that spans more than 400 years, an integral part of Amsterdam's heritage. Visit the Museum of the Canals, featuring exhibits and activities. (Moderate)

Free Time: Return to the ship for lunch and then head back out to explore more of Amsterdam on your own this afternoon.

Canals of Amsterdam. Walk or take a short ride from the ship to a pier and board a canal cruiser for a delightful early evening tour of Amsterdam's iconic canals. The three main canals were dug during the Golden Age of the 17th century, and the central area is now a UNESCO World Heritage site. Admire some of the city's 1,500 bridges, dozens of islands, charming Dutch homes and the architectural gems of the bustling city harbor during a guided cruise with a local expert. (Moderate; getting on and off the boat requires climbing up and down steep steps that are rocking in the water)

Enrichment: Contemporary Holland. Review the current state of affairs in the Netherlands, a constitutional monarchy, and discuss its future as a member of the European Union with a local expert.

Day 16 | Depart for gateway city

After breakfast, bid farewell to your fellow travelers and disembark the ship in Amsterdam.

AHI FlexAir passengers traveling on flights that qualify for a group transfer and Cruise Program passengers who have purchased seats on the group transfer depart for the Amsterdam Airport Schiphol for your return flights home. Your Travel Director will provide the details.
